### Next steps

#### 1. Get to Know Us

If you will be new to Woodbridge School, we would love to meet you, and are managing visits on an individual basis. #### 2. Understand the Admissions Process

There is a lot to take in, as prospective students and parents, whether you are considering joining from the Senior School or from another school. We know how important this decision is and we are here to guide and support you through the process.

#### 3. Register

If you are looking to join Woodbridge School Sixth Form from a school other than the Senior School, we would encourage you to apply formally. You will be invited to the next phases of the admissions process, as outlined below, and will be kept up-to-date with school events.

### Admissions process

Sixth Form students have two interviews, as well as sitting the CAT 4 entrance test. The interviews and entrance assessments are booked individually and take place in the autumn term. Due to the current restrictions, the interviews and assessments will take place virtually.

Students' grades must be consistent with them achieving a minimum of six '6' grades and two '5' grades at GCSE. Students will generally need a minimum of a grade '7' in the subjects proposed for study at A Level, and this may be higher for some subjects.

## Overseas Applications

All overseas applicants follow the same entrance process; interviews are carried out via Zoom or Skype. We ask that candidates sit the entrance exam at their agent's office, or British Council offices, where possible.
